ORDER:

The Registrar, Bharath Institute of Higher Education and Research, Chennai has requested the Government to grant permission to start four years B.Sc (Nursing) course in the name and style as "Bhaarath College of Nursing and Hospital" at Agharam Village, Selaiyur, Chennai with an annual intake of 100 students from the academic year 2020-2021.

- 2. In Government letter sixth read above, the Director of Medical Education was requested to conduct an inspection on the premises of the Trust for considering their request. Accordingly, the Director of Medical Education has constituted an inspection team to verify as to whether the proposed nursing college has fulfilled the conditions prescribed by the Government in the Government Orders first to fifth read above and as per the norms of the Indian Nursing Council, New Delhi.
- 3. In his letter seventh read above, the Director of Medical Education has submitted the proposal stating that the said institution has fulfilled all the norms prescribed by the Government as well as by the Indian Nursing Council of India and recommended to grant permission to the Registrar, Bharath Institute of Higher Education and Research, Chennai to start four years B.Sc (Nursing) course in the name and style as "Bhaarath College of Nursing" at Agharam Village, Selaiyur, Chennai with an annual intake of 100 students from the academic year 2020-2021.
- 4. The Government have examined the case in detail in the light of the Inspection Report and the recommendation of the Director of Medical Education and grant permission to the Registrar, Bharath Institute of Higher Education and Research, Chennai run by Sri Lakshmi Ammal Educational Trust, Chennai to start four years B.Sc (Nursing) course with an annual intake of 100 (Hundred) seats in the name and style as "Bhaarath College of Nursing" as per the inspection team report and recommendation of the Director of Medical Education in S.F. Nos.302/1A, 304/6, 304/5, 317/2A, 317/2B, 317/2D, 317/1B, 317/2, 317/5, 317/4, 318/8, 318/7, 318/6C, and 318/6A in the existing building of Bhaarath Medical College and Hospital, Selaiyur, Chennai 600 073, subject to the following conditions before admitting the students:
 - i. Admission of students shall be made as per the rules fixed by the Government from time to time.
 - ii. Tuition fees including special fees should be collected from the students at the same rates as prescribed by the Government from time to time. The Management should also give separate undertaking stating that No CAPITATION FEE or any other fund in the name of building fund, etc. will be collected from the students who seek admission in the said nursing college.
 - iii. The Government have the right to utilize the Government Endowment fund created by the Trust in meeting the justifiable payment to students that may arise due to non compliance of rules and regulations of the Government by the Trust like, winding of course without valid reasons etc.

- The Institute so permitted to conduct the course will be iv. allowed to shift / change the study centres only after completion of three years from the date of actual commencement of the course by the first batch of students, after getting orders of Government on inspection of the centres.
- The Trust should not run any other Nursing institution within 10 kms radius.
- The Trust should obtain recognition from the Tamil Nadu Nurses and Midwives Council, Chennai and if needed, suitability from Indian Nursing Council, New Delhi, respectively
- 5. The Director of Medical Education is directed to take necessary further action accordingly.
